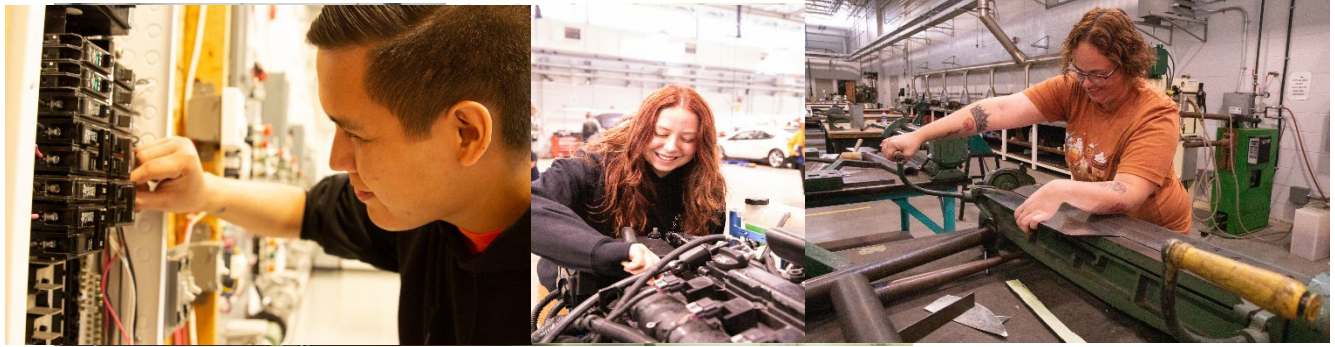

What you'll Learn	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Good work habits, safe work practices ◆ Hands-on sampling in multiple trades ◆ Specific safety certification ◆ Direct knowledge to make an informed decision about trade pathways
Eligibility	<p>Eligible indigenous peoples must live in BC, be legally entitled to work in Canada, not be a full-time student, and have a strong desire to enter the trades workforce, plus are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ unemployed or ◆ Precariously employed (under 20 hrs/wk) (i.e. low-skilled, under-employed) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ and actively seeking full-time employment
Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Program sponsorship includes tuition, student fees, instructional costs, program supplies and some personal supports
