In recognition of this, CFIA is seeking to commission primarily WSÁNEĆ art works that reflect the history and culture of the Pauquachin (BOKEĆEN), Tsartlip (WJOŁEŁP), Tsawout (STÁUTW) and Tseycum (WSIKEM), and Malahat First Nations.

We would like your help in identifying artists that are available to produce this artwork and we will be reaching out directly to the artists. A list of the artwork being commissioned is provided in Annex A of this letter. It would be greatly appreciated if you could look at the list and provide us the name and email address of the artist(s) you think could be a good fit by August 31st, 2023.
