The evening kicks off with a facilitated discussion with the artist discussing decolonization, reconciliation, language keeping and her career, including her involvement in the hit HBO series True Detective: Night Country.

- 5. Sechile Sedare-April 25 2025 This contemporary roots duo features sibling songwriters Leela Gilday and Jay Gilday. Sechile Sedare (pronounced 'seh-chee-leh' 'seh-dahr-eh') means 'my younger brother, my older sister' in the Dene language. The musical collaboration sees Jay and Leela co-create a new repertoire together, harnessing their talents as deeply insightful and genuine storytellers.
